



JAMES “Jim” LITTLEFIELD

Although involved in athletics for only two years at York High, Jim’s impact in three different sports was enormous. He was recognized in local papers as “one of the best athletes in Southern Maine.”

- In his first year at York, quarterbacked the football team to the State Championship, throwing 13 Touchdown passes in the process (1965).
- Scored 826 points in only 2 years (basketball).
- Helped the team to a Western Maine Tourney appearance where he scored over 30 points in a losing effort (1967).
- Averaged 24.4 points per game accumulating 513 points in his senior year - most in York History.
- Led his team with a .379 batting average as well as in home runs, triples, doubles, and assists.
- Captained all three teams (football, basketball, baseball) his senior year and was named Athlete of the Year.
